- 1) For a student to be eligible the household adjusted gross income (excluding that of dependent children) as indicated on line 37 of the IRS Tax Form 1040 must be less than that listed on the chart below for the number of children the parent or guardian is supporting in Adventist owned and operated schools, PreK through college.

THREE-WAY STUDENT AID PLAN

The Southern New England Conference has made provision to grant student aid funds to worthy students attending SNEC Elementary Schools, Greater Boston Academy, South Lancaster Academy, Hartford SDA Area School (Grades 9-12 only), SDA Conference Operated Boarding Academies who might otherwise be deprived of a Christian education, and Atlantic Union College.

The Three-Way Student Aid Plan is shared on a one-third basis by the local church, the Conference and the school (if the school outside of Southern New England Conference will participate). Participation is as follows:

Once the local church board votes to appropriate matching funds for this program, the church treasurer will send the application and a check for the church's share, to the Conference Treasurer at the address listed above. **Please do not send the application and check directly to the school.** Once approved by the Conference, a check covering the Conference portion and the church portion will be forwarded to the elementary school, academy or college for credit to the student's account. These scholarship funds are paid twice each year, during the months of November and April. Upon receiving these funds the participating elementary school, academy or college will credit its portion of student aid to the student's account.

It is understood that parents and relatives ARE NOT permitted to make a specific contribution to the local church student aid fund for their son, daughter, or relative, with the thought in mind of having it sent on to the Conference and school for matching funds.
