David is struggling. "My heart is overwhelmed!" he tells the Lord. If we are honest, many of us can relate to, can identify with, the feelings of David. We know what it is like to sit in darkness and wonder if light will ever come. When will my health issues improve? When will COVID end? When will I get a job? Will I be able to pay my bills this week? Maybe that is where you find yourself today.

I want to point out that in his trouble, David calls out to God in prayer. He knows the only way he can find rest and safety is in the Rock of Salvation. The only way he can find rest and safety is if God reaches down and places him atop the rock. See, in God, David has always found shelter. In God, he has found rest, comfort, and retreat. So why would he not, in his darkest moments, cry out to God, who is his "rock," his hiding place, and his fortress? And as he cries out, David finds comfort in God's grace and care.

Sometimes, when our hearts are overwhelmed, the best thing we can do is cry out to God and ask that in our desperation and fear, God would place us on stable ground, that God would comfort us and lead us to safety, that God would shelter us and deliver us. What is overwhelming you in this season of cold and winter and taxes and COVID and racial injustice and political turmoil? What weighs heavy on your heart?

Hopefully, the words of this song and Psalm will bring you comfort, and a small amount of peace, as you remember that when your heart is overwhelmed, you can always find rest in God, your rock. May you sense His presence today!
